AAF&G "GUN SCHOOL" STARTS

Calling all provisional members! If you've been working on getting your provisional card signed with your 3 shooting activities here's the last piece you need before you request full membership at the end of your six month provisional period.

Rather than reinventing the wheel, we use the NRA's **Home Firearm Safety Course**. For experienced shooters this is a refresher course with an opportunity to play with a variety of different actions. For an inexperienced shooter, or a single discipline shooter, it's a chance to handle other kinds of guns. The course teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and explains the attitude necessary for the safe handling and storage of firearms and ammunition in the home.

Details: (from the NRA course description)

This is a four-hour course for safe gun handling that is conducted in the classroom only. Students are taught NRA's three rules for safe gun handling; primary causes of firearms accidents; firearm parts; how to unload certain action types; ammunition components; cleaning; care; safe storage of firearms in the home; and the benefits of becoming an active participant in the shooting sports. Students will receive the NRA Home Firearm Safety handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, Basic Firearm Training Program brochure, course completion certificate.

The course and the materials are at no cost to our provisional members. Other members are welcome to attend for \$25.

The first course is scheduled for Sunday, March 27 at 1 pm in the club house. Pre-registration is required. Please email Meg at marston.clarke@verizon.net to save a place.

The AAF&G Bullseye Pistol season has started for 2011! That means the BE pistol committee planning meeting was held, and what a great meeting it was! On Thursday evening, Feb. 3rd, with short notice, we had a great turnout of 13 pistol shooters at the clubhouse. Thank you to the following attendees for their desire to be involved, and their input at the meeting: Frank Calcaterra, Gordon Davids, Fran Filippelli, Erick Graves, Ed Grove, Keith Herrington, John Hollingshead, Mike Kalnoske, Mike McGrath, Steve Peters, Dennis Walls, and Rick Weidmann. Many decisions were made, including tournament dates and refinement of maintenance and project needs.

Many positions need to be filled to complete our staffing for the nine NRA sanctioned tournaments we will be conducting in 2011. For those of you who would like to get involved with BE pistol shooting, working on the firing line is one way to get a good feel for the conduct of NRA matches, and is a great opportunity to see some of the best BE pistol competitors on the east coast close up! No pistol experience is required. An in-depth briefing is held before each tournament, and Chief Range officers (CROs) and assistants (ACROs) work closely with all line officers. ATTENTION PLINKING RANGE USERS

Currently, the various wood frames on the range are in disrepair and can only be used if you take a hammer and nails and maybe a screwgun to fashion a frame together. Additionally, cardboard is scarce. To avoid being disappointed, I suggest that you bring your own furring strips and cardboard if you want to insure you have a good shooting day on the plinking range. The black metal bases can be used for holding the furring strips.

Starting Saturday 2/26, I will be converting the plinking range over to a different type of target frame holder. My plan is to make it identical to the High Power range so that you can use furring strips to hold up the cardboard or insert the legs of your own target frame. I am planning to put PVC holders at the 21' and 50' distances. We will still have the black metal bases that you can use if you wish to shoot at other distances.

I also plan to hold workshops to help folks build their own folding target frames that they can use on the High Power and Plinking range. To standardize the workshop dates, I plan to have them starting in April on the second Thursday of the month. This way, you can build a frame and attend the members meeting as well. This will be weather permitting as we will be building out on a picnic table.

I would also like to have some volunteers to help out with the various tasks needed to keep the range up. If you are interested, please email me at johnandnanc182@yahoo.com.

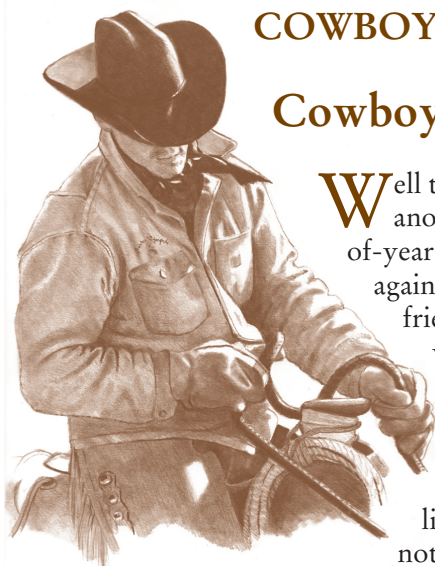
