## GUNSMITHING 101

Some of you that know me know that I had a gun smith business for many years. For those of you that don't, I don't do it anymore as a business so don't come running with gun in hand. I do however; work on members guns from time to time when I have time to spare.

In recent years, more and more people have been obtaining a Federal 03 FFL (Curio and Relic) and more and more guns are being classified as Curio and Relics. Getting such an FFL is easy and probably the best \$30 you will ever spend if you like guns and shooting. That said, there are some mighty cheap Mosin Nagant and Mauser rifles on the market today. As an 03 FFL holder, you can have these guns shipped right to your house! This article is for you folks that already own such fine firearms and are interested in making them more shootable. With minimal work, they can be made to shoot tighter groups with crisper triggers.

If the interest is there, I would be willing to put on a little seminar on complete teardown, making triggers lighter and crisper, and bedding the barrels and action. Now I'm not talking about making any modifications other than what was done by Russian and German armorers to get these rifles to shoot straight. The only modifications that can't be undone will be the stoning needed on the sears and some wood sanding, if needed, of the barrel channel in the forearm. The fact is, these rifles can be made to shoot much better with the simple addition of some tape, cork, brass sheet and some elbow grease.

I can probably cover both the Mauser and Mosin Nagant rifles in a 2 to 3 hr session. My plan would be to have it on a Sunday, either around 10AM or 1PM. If you are interested in having such a seminar, drop me a note to [johnandnanc182@yahoo.com](mailto:johnandnanc182@yahoo.com). Just so you know, I will be bringing my guns to use for illustrations. You do not need to bring anything but a notebook, pencil and a camera if you want to take pics.

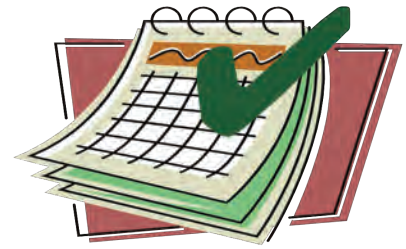
## Ernie Clarke Memorial Shoot Continues

Sunday afternoon, July 24<sup>th</sup>, had 14 of our provisional members, as well as an established member and his wife, attending AAF&G “Gun School”, our name for the NRA’s Home Firearm Safety Course. What an afternoon we had!

The course teaches the basic knowledge and skills and explains the attitude necessary for the SAFE handling and storage of firearms and ammunition in the home. We covered the NRA’s rules for gun safety and safe gun handling; primary causes of firearms accidents; firearm parts; how to unload a variety of action types; ammunition components; the cleaning, care and safe storage of firearms in the home.

Since almost everyone attending was a gun enthusiast, and a number of the attendees are very experienced shooters, we were able to do some in depth discussion of favored types of shooting and shooting products in addition to the basic course.

### HUNTER SAFETY CLASS REMINDER

This is a short reminder about the Hunter Safety class at AAF&G this year.

The only Hunter Education and Firearms Safety class for 2011 at AAF&G will be conducted on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday Sep 27th, 29th, and Oct 1st. ### SIX (6) MORE PROVISIONAL MEMBERS ACCEPTED AS FULL MEMBERS

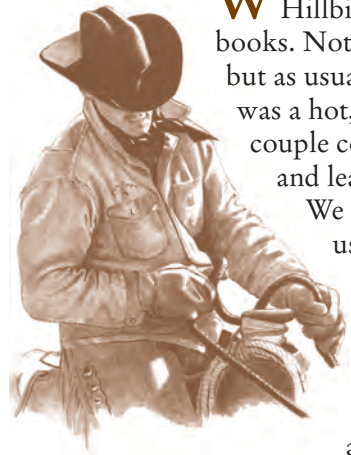

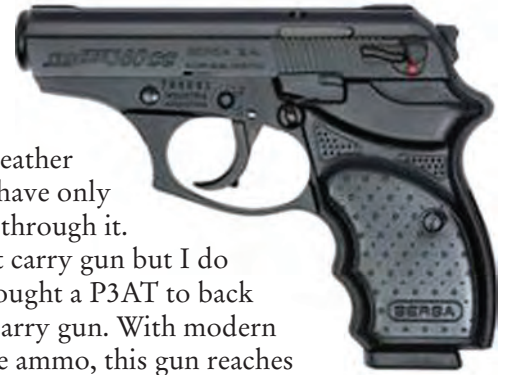

## SHOOTER QUALIFICATION CARD PROGRAM REMINDER

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR), Wildlife and Heritage Service offers a Shooter Qualification Program which AAF&G, in conjunction with the club's Hunter Safety program, has made available at the club rifle range for the past 5 years at no cost to members or participating non-members. Those hunters who meet certain shooting qualification standards (below) will become certified and receive a Maryland State Shooter Qualification Card valid for the current hunting season (2011-2012). This card serves as "proof of proficiency" and enables a qualified hunter to be eligible to apply for many of the managed deer hunts held across Maryland.

This year the DNR sanctioned Shooter Qualification events will be held at AAF&G on Friday, Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup>, from 1000 to 1500 and on Friday, Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, also from 1000 to 1500.

To become certified, shooters must meet the following qualifications:

**Shotgun:** 3 out of 5 shots in a 9-inch circle at 40 yards,

**Muzzleloader:** 2 out of 3 shots in a 9-inch circle at 40 yards, and

**Bow:** 3 out of 5 in vitals of a 3D deer and unmarked distances under 30 yards.

(Bow qualifications will be conducted on noted firearms qualification days but on the AAF&G Archery Range.)

## BULLSEYE PISTOL REPORT

Well it finally happened! After many trials and tribulations, Anne

Arundel Fish and Game hosted the first ever revolver championship in the state of Maryland. Called the **2011 MID-ATLANTIC REVOLVER REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP**, it was held August 20<sup>th</sup>, and took almost two years for it to occur. Originally scheduled for August of 2010, the two revolver 1800 was cancelled because we could not hold an NRA Distinguished Revolver Match (DR) along with the championship. The NRA had recently changed the criteria for holding a DR match from being held with a registered tournament to a regional tournament. When we attempted to apply for running a regional we were turned down because we were restricting it to one type of pistol; though this restriction was not stated anywhere in the rules. Not to be denied, John Hollingshead submitted a new rule for consideration by the NRA Pistol Rules Committee in the fall, which allowed the designation of a single type of pistol for a regional tournament. The rule was adopted, and the rest is History!

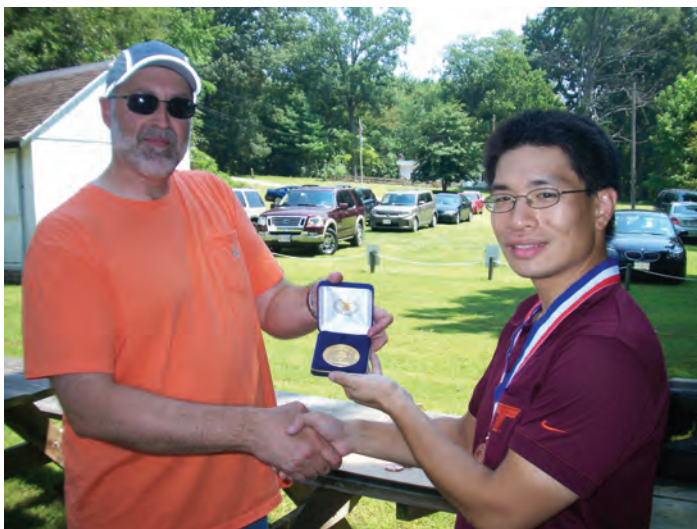

## PLINKING RANGE UPDATE

You should be seeing more colored squares of wood on the range these days. Their purpose is to cover the PVC tubing so that earth and debris don't fill up the holes. Please don't step on them. I have already replaced over 50% of them due to breakage. I am currently painting them day glow orange in the hopes that they will be more visible.

Some folks have been taking stakes from the Action Pistol range to use on the plinking range. ***THIS PRACTICE MUST STOP!*** Those stakes are bought and paid for by the IDPA shooters. Those of you doing this can either build your own frame or buy sticks at Home Depot and staple cardboard to them.

Recently I have been approached by some members who would like to shoot the shotguns they keep for home defense at IDPA type targets on the plinking range. The reasons given me were:

- 1) You cannot shoot on the high power 25yd target, and
- 2) Shooting at household distances at the metal pattern board would be dangerous with home defense loads.

I agree. I have just done some good reading about the new home defense shotgun loads and learned a lot. The buck and ball in the new loads is harder and fired at higher velocities than ever before. I sure wouldn't want to be shooting at steel from 21 feet with them!

After giving this some thought, I agree it would be a good idea. Many people keep a shotgun loaded for home defense but have no idea how it will pattern at 21 foot

distances. Now that more folks are making their own target frames, the issue of tearing up range equipment is rendered moot.

In order to allow this type of shooting, we will need to get the range rules changed and get the Safety Committee to observe it in action. I am currently writing up a proposal to present to the board of directors. I would appreciate anyone interested this type of shooting to email me your comments, both for and against, to [johnandnanc182@yahoo.com](mailto:johnandnanc182@yahoo.com).

## Camp Perry Matches

AAF&G was represented by two members at the Civilian Marksmanship Program’s (CMP) National Rimfire Sporter Matches and by three members at the CMP’s National Garand-Springfield-Vintage Military (GSM) Games Matches at Camp Perry, OH in July and August.

On July 24<sup>th</sup> **John Kerrigan** and **Bill Palk** participated in the Rimfire Sporter matches and Bill came away with a silver medal and John won two bronze medals. There were three classes of rifles...open sights, scopes and aperture sights, and tactical rifles. Bill silver was won in the open sight class and John’s bronze medals were for the scoped/aperture sight class and the tactical class. The course of fire is the same for all classes, but the medal cut off scores are all different. The course of fire consists of 10 shots prone, slowfire in 5 minutes, followed by two relays of 5 shots each fired in 25 seconds for semi-auto rifles and 30 seconds for manual bolt action rifles. Then there is a sitting/kneeling 10 shot slowfire phase followed by two relays of 5 shots each fired in 25 seconds for semi-auto rifles and 30 seconds for manual bolt action rifles. Lastly there is a 10 shot offhand (standing) slowfire phase followed by two relays of 5 shots each fired in 25 seconds for semi-auto rifles and 30 seconds for manual bolt action rifles. Unlike last years torrential rain out of Canada across the lake, the weather this year was perfect. No weather excuses for poor performance!

John Kerrigan and Bill Palk, primed by the sniper match they competed in at the CMP Eastern regional Games at Camp Butner this past May, were eager to compete on Tuesday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>, in the first National Vintage Sniper Team Match and thanks to a lot of preparation, practice, and zeroing were able to come in 14<sup>th</sup> out of a field of 139 teams. Each team member shot 10 rounds at a target at 300 yards and then they moved back to 600 yards and each fired another 10 rounds. Targets at both

Bill shot a 94/2X at 300 yards and a 94/2x at 600 yards for an individual total of 188/4x. The team total was 379/5X. The first place score was 391/9X. The AAF&G team used an original Swedish M41B sniper rifle with 4x Ajack scope for the 300 yard phase and a replica M1903A1 USMC sniper rifle with 8x Lyman Junior Targetspot scope for the 600 yard phase. Medals were awarded for the top twenty-five teams but they were not ready for the match so no photos are available.

The next day, Thursday, **Andy McKinney** joined John and Bill for the M1 Carbine match. Andy earned a Bronze medal in this match with a 320/2X placing him 203rd out of 518 competitors. Not too shabby considering the quality of the issued ammunition.

Military Rifle match in the afternoon. With these matches all competitors pull pit duty either before or after they shoot. John and Bill shot their Springfields first and then had pit duty afterwards in the late morning. They then stayed in the pits for pit duty for the Vintage match and

distances were exposed for only 20 seconds and the wind was sporadically blowing left to right at 15-20 mph. John shot a 97/1x at 300 yards and 94 at 600 yards for an individual total of 191/1X.

Both John and Bill shot M1917 Enfields for the Vintage match and while neither brought home a medal for either the Springfield or Vintage matches, both were pleased with the performance of their guns if not of themselves with Bill shooting a 256/2X with the Springfield and a

256/3X with the M1917. John shot a 243/1X with the Springfield and a 249/1X with his M1917.

The last day was the John C. Garand match and all three AAF&G shooters competed along with 1,209 other M1 Garand shooters. Andy led the AAF&G pack with a 259/1X followed by Bill with a 251/2X and John with a 229/1X. The Springfield, Vintage Military, and Garand matches are all fired at 200 yards and the Carbine at 100 yards.

The weather at Camp Perry can be fickle with fog, rain, steady and gusting wind, blazing sun, and high humidity all in one day. It can also be pleasant with relatively low humidity, sunny with only a few clouds, and light

# IDPA ACTION PISTOL

*What would bring over 20 shooters to the AAFG Action Pistol Range in 100 degree weather on July 23, 2011?  
International Defensive Pistol Association (IDPA) 3-gun ... that's what !!*

IDPA has grown to include multi-gun matches that include not only pistols but rifles and shotguns. For those of you not familiar, IDPA is a shooting competition organization that promotes simulated real-world defensive scenarios. IDPA combines safe gun handling with body movement as well as swift and accurate shooting. IDPA competitions are made up of several unique scenarios, called stages, that test a contestant's skill with firearms. Scoring is based on time to complete a stage and accuracy. For shots placed outside a center hit on target, a time penalty is assessed to the overall shooting time. Shooter with the lowest overall time is the winner. Shooters compete against similar skilled competitors based on skill classifications, Novice through Master. Furthermore, competitors are placed in equipment divisions based on firearm type. IDPA tries to keep the competition fair for new shooters as well as seasoned Master Class shooters.

## AAFG's July 23rd IDPA 3 Gun match had 3 stages and 23 registered competitors.

**STAGE 1** was a pistol and rifle stage. Shooters started with a holstered pistol. At the start signal, the shooter drew pistol and engaged paper and steel targets while moving across the shooting bay towards a pre-staged rifle. Once the shooter arrived at his or her rifle, their pistol was safely decked on a table. The shooter then retrieved their rifle and continued to shoot the course of fire. The evil course designer for this stage placed a swinging target at the back of the bay to test their rifle skills at a partially blocked moving target. While the shots on the swinger were challenging, they were also very fun. More than a few shooters walked away with a smile after shooting this stage.

**STAGE 2** included all three guns: pistol, rifle and shotgun. The shooters started with their pistol and engaged paper and steel targets on the move all the while negotiating the course towards their pre-staged shotgun. Shotgun targets were both steel and stationary clay birds. Finally,

competitors transitioned to rifle to complete the stage. Rifle targets were small in size to simulated rifle distance on a pistol range.

**STAGE 3** also included pistol, rifle and shotgun at the maximum distance of the shooting bay. A unique twist on stage three was a 22 Long Rifle, scoped, bolt action pick-up gun that each competitor shot prone as part of the course of fire. Again, judging from the smiles of competitors coming off the shooting line, people seemed to like this stage a lot.

What makes 3-gun shooting so interesting is that you never know what each stage will bring. One stage can be relatively simple then the next stage can involve multiple firearms and a demanding course of fire. The best part of 3-gun shooting, in my mind, is the ability to practice shooting skills with three different firearm types at the same time in a fun and safe environment – this is truly an enjoyable experience.

When the smoke settled and the scores tallied, the results of the July 23, 2011 AAFG 3 Gun match looked like this (by division):



At the start signal, draw pistol and from cover at P1 engage all visible steel poppers in tactical priority until they fall. Then move to P2, engaging T1 and T2 with three rounds each and popper S1 until it falls, in tactical priority, while moving. All pistol shots fired after leaving cover must be taken on the move. S1 must fall to activate swinger; failure to activate swinger will incur PE, FTN, and appropriate misses.

Deck safe pistol on the table at P2 and retrieve rifle. With the rifle, engage T3 (swinger) and T4 with five shots each from P2.

Note: A "safe" pistol means either completely unloaded or in mechanically appropriate condition for starting a stage (e.g., on safe or decocked).
